“Hole In One for \$1 Million Shootout”

Oahe Family YMCA Mission Statement:

Purpose:

The purpose for the Oahe Family YMCA *“Hole In One for \$1 Million Shootout”* is to increase awareness of the **“Partner With the Y”** Financial Assistance Program and to raise money for that program to better serve the citizens of Pierre and the surrounding area. All net income will go to support the YMCA **“Partner With the Y”** Financial Assistance Program.

General Event Description:

The *“Hole In One for \$1 Million Shootout”* has a relatively simple procedure. All qualifying rounds and final round will be conducted by YMCA staff and/or volunteers in compliance with the insurance contract.

Qualifying Rounds:

Qualifying rounds will be held the three weeks leading up to the finals. These qualifying rounds will be held at local golf courses and will consist of the following:

Golfers will shoot from the tee area of the driving range with each golfer using a different color ball. A golf flag will be placed approximately 120-140 yards away from the tee boxes with a 10 foot circle around the flag. Participants will get their first ball at no charge. If they do not qualify with their first ball they may purchase balls at \$1 per ball and then try and get their ball within the circle. Participants may purchase as many balls as they want until they qualify. Once they hit a ball in the circle they will move on to the semi-final round. Each golfer may qualify more than one ball for the semi-final round.

Semi-final Round:

The semi-final round will be held the weekend before the finals. Times will be set for first round qualifiers to come and attempt to make the top 10 participants that move on to the finals. The flag will be set approximately 120-140 yards from the tee box. The 10 closest to the pin balls will move to the final round. Each first round qualifier will be given one ball for each time they qualified at no charge to hit. They may purchase additional balls at 3 for \$5 to better their chances to make the finals. At the end of the designated semi-final round qualifying time the 10 participants with shots closest to the pin will move on to the final round. All shots must take place within the allotted semi-final times. If a first round qualifier fails to make it to the designated semi-final times they will forfeit their chance to qualify for the final round. The 10 finalists will be notified following the semi-final rounds and at least 24 hours before the finals. Finalists must be able to attend the final round. If a finalist cannot attend then the next person closest to the pin will take their place in the finals.

Final Round:

The final round will be held on one of the regulation par 3 holes of the hosting course under the supervision of the host professional and in compliance with conditions stated in the contract. The 10 finalists will get one shot to make the hole in one. The order of shots will be determined by the finalist ranking. The qualifier with the shot furthest away from the hole in the semi-finals will shoot first; the qualifier with the second furthest away from the hole in the semi-finals will shoot second and so on with the finalist with the closest to the hole in the semi-finals shooting last. If a hole in one is not made then prizes will be awarded for closest to the pin, second closest and so on for all 10 finalists. If a hole in one is made the remaining finalists will receive prizes for closest to the pin following the same format. Should there be more than one hole in one made in the final round all participants making holes in one will be awarded separate \$1 million prizes. The \$1 million prize will be awarded only if the hole in one is made in the final round and documented according to the contract. If a hole in one is made the winner(s) will receive the prize money under the terms set by the contract and will be responsible for any and all taxes and/or other fees associated with the prize money.
